Additionally, I would want to add additional dollars for parents to allot towards sports fees as they currently must file for reimbursement after the fact instead of having the option included without providing their own cash. Transportation funding must also be addressed for transporting children to and from “off-site” education opportunities such as field trips. Finally, correspondence school children and their families need more access to contact teachers.
